

Operation Updates

Our leadership team is committed to minimizing the risk to the Hallmark University community while protecting our ability to provide services and operations with as little disruption as possible. In response to the ongoing Coronavirus pandemic, Hallmark University has taken the following precautionary steps to ensure the safety of students, faculty, and staff.

- All courses at Hallmark University have been moved to an online format, with students attending virtual classes with their instructors until further notice.
- The facilities team has stepped up the frequency of cleaning of common areas while evening cleaning crews use disinfectants on table surfaces as well as keyboards and computers in offices and classrooms.
- Hallmark University has made the difficult decision to cancel the Spring Graduation Ceremony due to the COVID-19 guidance for travel and holding large gatherings. At this time there is no plan to reschedule the spring ceremony and all students will be given the opportunity and encouraged to walk the stage in November.

Aviation

Students studying to become licensed Aircraft Technicians will now be able to train on a new aircraft on permanent loan from the United States Air Force. The jet, a Northrop T-38 Talon, is a supersonic jet used to train pilots for the Air Force and Navy. The College of Aeronautics received the new aircraft after a series of approvals from the Department of Defense to prepare students who join the Air Force Civilian Service after graduating to work on the growing fleet of T-38's at Randolph Air Force Base in San Antonio.
