Memo From Leadership



As Hallmark has just begun its 50th year, has anyone else noticed that it feels more like a startup than a 50 year old university? In the lifecycle of organizations, they start off like a birth, with lots of effort and struggle, followed by joy and exuberance with each small victory. That was 1969 for Hallmark.
